Short summary of the 2016 development/plans so far:

As this year is the Lonely Planet year in Transilvania, we expect people from all over the world to come by at our castle!

3. There's a regular trunktable (Stammtisch) in Munich, you're invited to come once or often to spend time with some good guys, beer and project ideas.

4. The results of the TU Munich Project are out. We have now more than 30 amazing posters of 7 different projects about Transilvanian landscape development. This should be the fundament for our exhibitions in Movile, Sibiu and Sighisoara. Find attached another teaser of two project groups.

The churchfortress-project was chosen as 10th project of an international travelling exhibition by Arne Franke, a famous author for fortified churches in Transilvania and old Castle in Silesia (Schlesien) in Poland. <http://www.arnefranke.de/publikationen/das-wehrhafte-sachsenland.html> The Exhibition will start this year in Germany and will travel to Romania, Sweden, France, Italy, Poland and even on the other continent. That means, we will have a construction site to learn professional wood crafting and fix the roof of our headquarter in the first half of the month. The second half will be about the preparation of the TB, that means collecting old and traditional recipes in the village, planning the cultural and musical program of this event, collecting "living history stories" by the Romanian, Roma and Saxon people, making a greenery plan and cutting trees, crafting furniture, installing electricity, preparing the best food you ever tasted...

7. We try to have some people in Hundertbücheln/Movile continuously from mai until october to get things done, experience the unique nature / landscape / bears and enjoy the good life. Please contact us if you want to become part of the movement and spend some days or weeks at our castle!

8. There will be the Saxon summer Party from 12 - 14. august, we expect around 150 Saxons in 100Bücheln, so appr. one and a half per hill. I'm sure this is going to be a unforgettable party with even more unforgettable stories and fun.
